Victorian Opera's mission 'to reimagine the potential of opera and musical theatre, for everyone' has never been more relevant for all our stakeholders. Perhaps it is the more than usually acute focus the previous two years have placed on what has emerged as important in our individual and collective lives - and how those perceptions might inform how we continue to operate as a major company in the national framework. In a time when circumstances have occasionally forced a society to re-examine itself, and to question received wisdoms in the context of social and political imperatives on an almost daily basis, I believe that professional companies might appropriately refocus their view of their obligations to the communities they are funded and supported to serve.

Opera, as I have often said, presents a window on the marvellous; its unique synthesis of poetry, music and theatrical image have the capacity to make revelations. The great works of the canon do this continually. Yet the strength of these inherited traditions enable new stories to be told to new

audiences through newly made works and through revisitation of classic texts which, because of their innate vitality, can speak afresh to every generation. Our artistic practice does not only centre around being a museum of past glories, but also in employing the generous expressive vocabulary of our heritage to tell stories that present opportunities for an encounter which delights, heals our souls, stimulates our capacity for wonder, offers the joy of discovery and affirms the strength and value of our own community - both audiences and performers - in the collective civic identities of Melbourne and Victoria.

Therefore, three new Australian works, The Selfish Giant, The Butterfly Lovers and A Christmas Carol, define the essential identity of our work in 2022. Each of these pieces explores the power of love, as well as the transforming power that is released through the capacity to embrace change through self-abandonment and living for others. All three works embrace diversity in conception, and especially in execution, and demonstrate the capacity



of our art form to speak to and embrace the rich demographic of this great and vital city.

The recognition of the energy and richness of community is central to the exploration of the experience of marginalisation in Happy End. the curtain-raiser to our suite of Weill productions over the next few years. The raw power of the characters and music of this work also had their origins in times of flux, change and uncertainty. The final concordat of the gangsters, the downtrodden and the Salvation Army offers a lively image of hope and co-operative striving for a better society - an image seasoned by humour, great characters and great tunes.

Our performance of *Elektra* will 'purge through pity

and terror'- the staggering invention of Strauss and Hofmannsthal's adaption of Sophocles presents the ritual cleansing and catharsis that our world seems to crave at the moment. The work has to be experienced live to appreciate its visceral energy and the overwhelming cumulatively fierce joy of its final moments. Elektra renews the spirit through ritual action - a new order emerges at a terrible cost - not an unfamiliar notion these days.

Not all is tragic and terrifying. Our job is also to entertain and offer simple enjoyment. Cinderella rides to the ball again in Launceston with a wonderful cast of Rossini singers and the mighty Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra, and Dorothy and Toto's pilgrimage down the Yellow Brick Road and her Witch-vanquishing triumph release and reunite an isolated and entombed community. Something refreshing to anticipate these days.

This is a program that celebrates Australian work, reaching out to everyone in our city (from Rock 'n Roll to Rossini) and reaffirming our creative community in productions that have added significance because of the weight of our shared experience of the last years.

We all look forward to working for you and with you in 2022.





Access All Areas: Livestream Program

Victorian Opera's innovative Access All Areas: Livestream Program returns in 2022 with Simon Bruckard and Emma Muir-Smith's new Australian opera *The Selfish Giant*.

Through four interactive workshops livestreamed direct to classrooms across Victoria, students will meet the opera singers starring in the production, explore the story, discover how the director shapes the action on stage, observe an orchestral rehearsal and learn about the creation of the costumes and set.

The four-week program concludes with a performance of *The Selfish Giant* at Arts Centre Melbourne – live on stage and also available to livestream.

In 2022, Victorian Opera will also stream *The Selfish Giant* into theatres and cinemas in Bendigo, Ballarat and Sale, providing local schools with an in-theatre experience.

Victorian Opera's Access All Areas: Livestream Program is a backstage pass to the opera, introducing primary school children to this incredible art form and demonstrating how a full-scale production is realised for the stage. The program aligns with Australian Curriculum General Capabilities and Learning Areas and is supported by a downloadable Education Resource.

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
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
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About Us

Be it live or online, Victorian Opera is here to inspire you.

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
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
