

CASTING BRIEF - English Eccentrics

Victorian Opera is calling for submissions from artists who wish to audition for its production of *English Eccentrics*, as part of the VO Emerges Program. The work is composed by Malcolm Williamson, with libretto by Geoffrey Dunn, based on the book by Edith Sitwell. The work will be sung in English.

KEY DATES

Rehearsals commence in Melbourne on Monday 11 June 2024, with performances at the Union Theatre, University of Melbourne from Thursday 4 July to Saturday 6 July 2024.

Auditions will be conducted in Melbourne on Wednesday 14, Thursday 15 and Friday 16 February 2024.

Artists are required to be Melbourne based for the duration of the production period.

BACKGROUND TO ENGLISH ECCENTRICS

Where English wit and Australian Iarrikinism collide, *English Eccentrics* offers a sideways look at a collection of quirky characters from English society. Bonkers and barking mad, each character more bizarre than the last, the opera introduces us to a weird and wonderful palette of aristocracy, tradesmen, maids and clergy and exploring the eccentricities that lie within.

Williamson's music is heavy on pastiche, from Mozart to Gershwin, and even sets a bit of *Romeo* and Juliet to a rumba, in *Eccentrics* we meet a total of 39 characters based on real eccentrics in Regency England. The scenes are bookended and divided by the observations of a twelve person SATB ensemble.

ROLES TO BE CAST

- MISS TYLNEY LONG (Soprano): Mad for her hatter.
- LORD PETERSHAM (Tenor): Snuff is enough.
- THOMAS PARR (Bass) and THE COUNTESS DESMOND (Mezzo): Putting the "age" into marriage.
- REVEREND JONES (Tenor): The Church of England has never been the same.
- MISS BESWICK (Soprano): A firm believer in her own resurrection.
- LORD ROKEBY (Baritone): A complete 'bath-kit' case.
- LADY LEWSON (Mezzo): Can't bathe, won't bathe.
- JOHN WARD (Tenor): He holds freeholds, he wants to be sure.
- MRS DARDS (Soprano): The reincarnation of fish stocks in stocks and in carnations.
- MAJOR PETER LABELLIERE (Bass): The only sane person in an insane world.
- ROMEO COATES (Tenor): An amateur Creole actor whose lack of talent and taste is no bar to popularity.
- SARAH WHITEHEAD (Soprano): Abandoned by her brother. A bank clerk, he loved her too well and after frittering away their money was hanged for forgery. Unknowing, she









- would wait every morning outside the Bank of England where he worked hoping to see him once again and to find their fortunes restored.
- DR DALMAHOY (Bass), DR GRAHAM (Tenor) and DR KATTERFELTO (Baritone): Fraudulent doctors in the park.
- BEAU BRUMMELL (Tenor): The great dandy and the greatest gossip.
- PHILIP THICKNESSE (Bass): An old military man and self-professed ornamental hermit denounces his libeller Labellierre and mourns the imminent loss of his ornamental hermitage.
- PRINCESS CARABOO (Soprano): Who appeared mysteriously at the door of a cottage
 in rural Gloucestershire and speaking no recognisable language conveyed that she was
 a Princess from an unknown foreign land.

- Rehearsals for the ensemble will be held on Wednesday evenings and Saturday days.
- Ensemble may also be required the evening of Thursday 27 June.
- Ensemble must be available for onstage rehearsals on the afternoon and evening of 29 June, 1, 2 and 3 July in addition to all performance dates.

Please only apply if you are fully available for the entire production period and all or part of the audition dates.

WHAT TO PREPARE

For the audition, please prepare a song of your choice in English (no longer than 3 minutes). A repetiteur will be provided on the day, and you will have the opportunity to do a short rehearsal with them before auditioning. Sheet music must be provided in the correct key with any cuts noted.
