On an artistic front, Victorian Opera presented a dazzling season of musical theatre gems (Candide, Sweeney Todd: The Demon Barber of Fleet Street), rarely staged operas (La Rondine (The Swallow), English Eccentrics), a First Nations children's opera (Parrwang Lifts the Sky), and a world premiere (Eucalyptus: The Opera). We are proud to deliver such outstanding offerings to audiences throughout Victoria and interstate.

Of immense importance to us is the ongoing, inspirational and generous support of our partners, sponsors and donors. Without them, Victorian Opera could not continue to thrive.

I wish to warmly thank my fellow board and committee members for their invaluable contributions, along with the tireless endeavours of Victorian Opera's Chief Executive, staff, technicians and artists in delivering another year of remarkable artistic achievements.

CEO MESSAGE

Season 2024 marked the official commencement of Stuart Maunder AM as the company's Artistic Director at Victorian Opera. After many years of close collaboration with the company, 2024 was the beginning of a new era for Victorian Opera and the continuation of a close working relationship following Stuart's already storied career.

Stuart's inaugural season as Artistic Director opened with a triumphant production of Leonard Bernstein's Candide at the Palais Theatre, generating much buzz among critics and audiences alike. Victorian Opera returned to our home venue, the Palais Theatre, with a season of Puccini's La Rondine (The Swallow) in the 100th anniversary year of the composer's death. Season 2024's mainstage season closed with the Melbourne premiere of Jonathan Mills and Meredith Oakes' long anticipated adaptation of Murray Bail's Miles Franklin Award-winning novel Eucalyptus. A co-production with Opera Australia, Brisbane Festival and Perth Festival, Eucalyptus: The Opera also received performance seasons as part of Perth and Brisbane Festival.

The company also presented an opera as part of Sydney Festival with a unique staging of Puccini's *II Tabarro* at the Australian National Maritime Museum. Sydney audiences were also treated to Opera Australia's season of co-production *Idomeneo* at the Sydney Opera House.

Stuart's hit production of Stephen Sondheim and Hugh Wheeler's Sweeney Todd: The Demon Barber of Fleet Street returned to Arts Centre Melbourne, Playhouse for a sold-out season. The production united many of the original cast and creative team, including Antoinette Halloran as Mrs Lovett and Victorian Opera's Head of Music Phoebe Briggs as Musical Director.

As part of the company's comprehensive Education program, Victorian Opera re-staged the First Nations opera *Parrwang Lifts the Sky* by Deborah Cheetham Fraillon AO for primary schools in Melbourne and Ballarat. This production was presented as part of the company's Access All Areas program, which delivers four on-demand workshops alongside the opera itself, with the option to watch intheatre, live digitally or on-demand.

The next generation of emerging talent took centre stage in *English Eccentrics* – an opportunity for many young artists to gain invaluable performance experience as well as a chance to delve into Australian composer Malcolm Williamson's rarely staged 1964 chamber opera.

I express my sincere thanks to Victorian Opera's artists, staff, board, patrons, trusts and foundations, and sponsors along with Creative Australia and the State Government of Victoria through Creative Victoria, for their incredible support in 2024.

Victorian Opera values this support wholly; support which enables us to collectively celebrate and share the joys and magic of this artform.

85 artists were coached across 554 private rehearsals for a total of 1359.8 hours.

WORLD PREMIERE

Victorian Opera and Opera Australia presented the world premiere of Jonathan Mills and Meredith Oakes' Eucalyptus: The Opera.

Based on Murray Bail's novel, Eucalyptus: The Opera was staged in Perth, Brisbane and Melbourne. It was presented in association with Opera Australia, Brisbane Festival, Perth Festival with West Australian Opera.

Total National Audience: 4,417

DIGITAL ACCESS

Livestream and on-demand Digital Access were available for two productions, both new Australian works: Parrwang Lifts the Sky and Eucalyptus: The Opera.

In addition, livestreamed works of 2023 productions were available on-demand in 2024: The Visitors and Galileo.

These productions reached an online audience of 1,555

INSPIRING AUDIENCES

Victorian Opera reached a national and international audience of

47,569

171

performances, activities and streamed events.

There were

6,388

unique views of Victorian Opera's Access All Areas: Livestream Program's four workshops and performance. They were streamed live and ondemand to 1,140 students and 103 teachers.

Victorian Opera's secondary school program Beyond the Stage had

406

unique views across its four workshops outlining of the creative processes of making a show. Across the program's in-theatre excursions to Sweeney Todd: The Demon Barber of Fleet Street and Eucalyptus: The Opera, there were 792 attendees from 15 schools.

Victorian Opera's work was seen across Australia, including seasons of Eucalyptus: The Opera at Perth Festival and Brisbane Festival, II Tabarro at Sydney Festival, and Idomeneo at the Sydney Opera House. These works reached a total audience of

12,527

Victorian Opera welcomed many new audiences to the theatre in 2024, including 49.9% new audience to Candide and 69.9% new audience members to Sweeney Todd: The Demon Barber of Fleet Street.

EDUCATION

In 2024, Victorian Opera continued to offer a broad range of Education and Pathway opportunities for young people and emerging artists.

Parrwang Lifts the Sky, by Deborah Cheetham Fraillon AO, returned to the stage as Victorian Opera's family and education opera. This production was the focus of Victorian Opera's Access All Areas program, where primary students learn how opera is made through four interactive, ondemand workshops. Their lessons were cemented by attending the performance live or watching it digitally. Victorian Opera thanks the Victorian Department of Education, which provides funding through the Strategic Partnerships Program, as well as the Marian & E.H. Flack Trust, William Angliss Charitable Fund and the Gailey Lazarus Foundation.

Victorian Opera continued to deliver Beyond the Stage as the flagship education program for secondary schools. Across a series of workshops, students focused on productions Sweeney Todd: The Demon Barber of Fleet Street and Eucalyptus: The Opera.

In 2024, Victorian Opera Youth Chorus Ensemble (VOYCE) had 47 participants who received expert musical guidance from VOYCE Director Angus Grant, repetiteurs Phoebe Briggs and Tom Griffiths, along with a series of special guest teachers. The ensemble had a successful year of performances. The 2024 Youth Opera, *Operabox*, was received with high acclaim, as was the annual Showcase Concert featuring Emerging Artists (Opera Prize winners) Michaela Cadwgan and Douglas Kelly.

A substantial philanthropic grant from Emeritus Professor Barbara Van Ernst AM provided ongoing financial support to both Victorian Opera's Youth Ambassadors Program and the New Work Opera Studio, in partnership with Montsalvat. Following the establishment of The New Work Opera Studio, composer Peter Rutherford and a group of six participants continued to work closely together on the development of a new family-friendly opera, *The Lyrebird's Voice*, which will premiere in 2025. This project beautifully showcased Victorian Opera's commitment to both new work and nurturing emerging talent.

Prior to Candide, Parrwang Lifts the Sky, English Eccentrics and Sweeney Todd, Victorian Opera's Youth Ambassadors enjoyed pre-show discussions together over a meal, learnt more with exclusive behindthe-scenes talks and tours from key production staff and received tickets to the performances.

Victorian Opera is proud of the Education and Pathway opportunities it provides, and is excited to continue engaging young people and emerging artists into the future.

PATRONS PLAYED A PRINCIPAL ROLE

In 2024, Victorian Opera's Patrons played a principal role in our success, demonstrated by their ongoing commitment to our work by making an annual donation to the company.


